The charter dues were only \$25. If our charter members instead decided to put that \$25 into a stock


such as Intel, that investment would be worth about \$9000 today. Clearly they made a better investment in the club as its value now is "priceless".

Knowledge of currents is vital to your success as a racing skipper. Even the cruising skipper will come away with an improved knowledge of tides and currents.


